The Secretary Report from the December meeting was approved.

Treasurer Joyce Marble reported the opening balance of \$2,993.47. The income was \$300.00 which was a partial refund of the deposit from Pane Vino which was initially reserved for the Governor's Visit and now that the Charter Night will be included this venue is no longer able to accomodate the number of people expected to attend. Expenses of \$2,309.98 include the cost of the cake for the Governor's visit, a donation to the Crohns and Colitis Foundation, lifetime membership for Marty Toombs and a down payment to Blue Heron Hills for the Governor's Visit and Charter Night for Eastern Wayne. The closing balance is \$983.49. This report was approved.

GUEST SPEAKER

Key Club Administrator John reported that there are 250 Key Clubs in the New York District and there were 13,036 members at the end of Last year. New York is the fourth largest District in Kiwanis International and many students hold leadership positions on the International Board. The NYD Key Club raised \$200,000 for charitable causes last year. Planning for this year's Leadership Training Conference is underway at the cost is \$385 per person. There are 5 Key Clubs in the Finger Lakes Division and John encouraged interaction with our Kiwanis Clubs. The cost to sponsor a new club is \$600 and information is on line.

Builder's Club Administrator Hazel said that New York is the fourth largest in Kiwanis International and the cost to sponsor a new club is \$400.
